Let's face it, small black tanks or cassette toilets are only good for weekends off grid. Any off grid extended stays (3-5 days or longer) needs something more. Why aren't manufacturers focused on maximizing the usage of their campers by directing gray water to flush toilets versus wasting fresh water for that purpose? Everyone talks solar and batteries to improve power availability and extend stay but you quickly run into constraints with the fresh/gray/black water and related tanks. I suggest that you develop a tool in association with your Truck Camper Chooser that provides comparative data points for off grid length of stay for the electrical and plumbing systems. That way we can properly compare a dry unit, 2-3 day or 4+ days off grid capability. You run a great publication and service to the industry and consumers.
